Workshop Management



- 66 work shops repairing assets

## **Our Operations**

AIRD Burkina Faso is there to support and compassionately transport displaced people to safety, while providing goods and services to build hope and resilience as they come to terms with having been forced to flee their homes.

In 2019 alone, AIRD Burkina Faso transported **855** Malian refugees. Managing a fleet of **12** trucks, **96** motorbikes and **71** light vehicles the team facilitated the movement of not only Persons of Concern, but also AIRD staff and other implementing partners. Fuel Management is a key function that keeps these vehicles and assets going. **420,554** litres of diesel were issued and consumed within the year at **3** fuel stations.

**850** emergency centres, **150** rub halls and **300** transitional shelters were constructed while **342** kilometres of road were rehabilitated. Transporting basic Non Food Items (NFIs) enables displaced people to restart their lives. AIRD Burkina Faso transported **4,846** tons of NFIs in 2019. Storage of these items is possible at 2 warehouses with a capacity of **3,820** m3 in different locations across the country.

Workshop Management is a key area for AIRD Burkina Faso. With 3 workshops and **1,108** job cards completed in 2019, the team was able to support the continued running of vehicles and assets in even the most remote areas served by various implementing partners.

In line with the overall goal of the organisation to do more for Persons of Concern, AIRD Burkina Faso intends to explore sustainable livelihoods, WASH and environmental sustainability initiatives to promote resilience and empowerment for displaced people and their host communities.










### Where we work



At the end of 2019, UNHCR reported that the population of concern in Burkina Faso was approximately **585,900**, including **560,000** IDPs, **25,900** refugees (mainly Malian nationals) and 30 asylum-seekers. These numbers represent individuals forcefully displaced and looking for safety and hope for a future. Many of these refugees also wish to return home and require resettlement assistance.

# We want to do even more...

By delivering excellent humanitarian logistics, construction and infrastructure support to donors, agencies and governments.

As conditions in camps and settlements stabilise, including to the point of return for some refugees, AIRD will become increasingly connected to the host communities, IDPs & refugees, through the provision of sustainable livelihoods, WASH and environmental assistance to build their resilience, and to help those not in their usual place of abode to return home well and equipped to enhance their own communities.

AIRD also will proactively seek to **grow operational programmes** by considering supporting work in countries neighbouring existing field activity sites as well as those further afield.

**Business development** will be considered to evaluate the merits of establishing AIRD's logistics, vehicle maintenance etc as a business.
